Arden became the camp handyman and loaded up this tools in a golf cart and traveled throughout the site making repairs and helping as needed. Kathy helped with laundry, cleaning rooms, painting and much more!

Arden and Kathy decided that winter 2016 would unfortunately be their last winter at Luther Springs. While we were saddened that their service was coming to an end, Luther Springs is truly blessed that Pastor Dan Kilts and his wife, Paulette, have assumed the vitally important role the Norums played at Luther Springs. Paulette and Dan are pictured [above] with Arden and Kathy, along with the signs that fellow volunteer, John Wuertz crafted for them.

Dan served as pastor at Faith, Jacksonville, Florida for 12 years and was a very active supporter of Luther Springs during his tenure. Dan retired in 2015. He and

want to be around, and I let go of the ones that had negative influences on me. I received courage to stand up to bullies and leave friends who brought me down. This has all made me stronger. Eventually

through all of these small but empowering touches of Jesus, I have confidence in my beliefs that I now can firmly stand for.

Lutheridge personally set up a two-way conference call with me and 'The Man Upstairs.' It really is a time where just you and God can reconnect through counselors who encourage you to try new things or pastors who proclaim messages that can and will lead you on a path to being better involved with your spiritual self. I can definitely attest to this! After every difficult school year since sixth grade, I have looked forward to being emotionally baptized all over again."

When recently asked for permission to publish her reflections in the LINK, Anna readily agreed and exclaimed, "My faith has gotten me through a lot in the years since I wrote the story; family, school, battling depression and social anxiety...In times of need, God gives me the strength and wisdom to overcome every challenge and obstacle I face. So with God's everlasting love and grace, I am pursuing a career in journalism in college...I will always be forever appreciative of the camp (Lutheridge) that led me down this path."

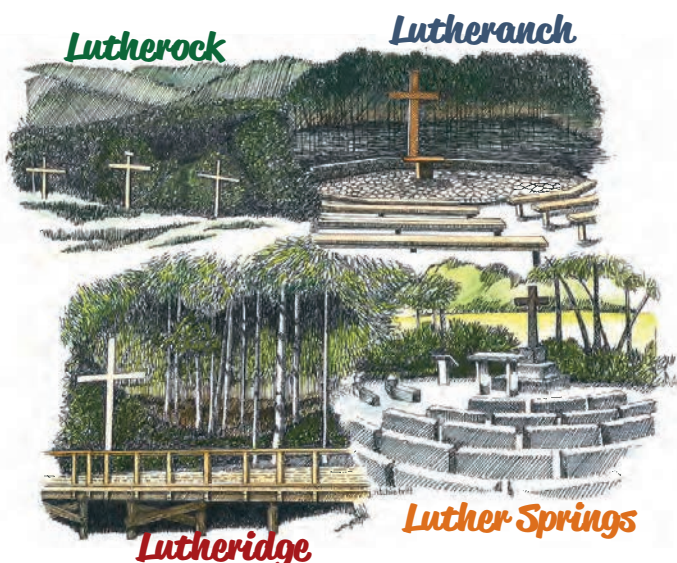

Worship Areas Artwork

Susan Troutman, NovusWay's long-time executive staff member is pictured below right, receiving a beautiful piece of artwork that was crafted by Joanna Ritchie Britt of Winston-Salem, NC, and commissioned by the Board of Trustees to be awarded to board members when they complete their service. Britt, pictured at the right, served on the NovusWay Board of Trustees from July 2007 to June 2014. She previously crafted another piece of artwork that depicted the entrances to Lutheridge, Lutherock, and Lutheranch. When Luther Springs became part of NovusWay, she graciously crafted a new piece of artwork and chose worship areas at each of the sites as a focus.

- **Lutheridge** – the worship area at Lake Lewthorne features a lighted cross that reflects on the lake and testifies to the centrality of Christ. It is the site for closing Vespers each Friday at summer camp;
- **Lutherock** – the worship area is the site for the “Life, Death, and Resurrection (LDR)” that depicts the life of Jesus and is a highlight of the summer camp week;
- **Luther Springs** – the worship area is the “Chapel of the Cross,” on the shores of Vause Lake and is the year round site for outdoor worship; and
- **Lutheranch** – the worship area is the new “St. Timothy Outdoor Chapel” that includes the altar from St. Timothy Lutheran Church, Forest Park, Georgia, that concluded its ministry in 2010.



When asked about her artwork, Britt exclaimed, “My inspirations for the drawing were the places themselves. They have individual personalities all their own and they create special places apart for those who have the privilege of resting at each. Lutheridge and Lutherock are special to me because I’ve spent extended time there as a child and adult and so have my own children. As a board member, I had the privilege of watching Lutheranch and Luther Springs grow and develop, and it has been beautiful to witness!”

Even though she wasn’t a board member, the artwork was awarded to Troutman because of her long and distinguished service to NovusWay. Troutman began serving as Business Manager for Lutheridge+Lutherock Ministries in the year 2000. She was promoted to Vice President for Finance and Support Services and later served as both Chief Operating

Officer and Chief Financial Officer before she concluded her service in June 2016. When asked about her time with NovusWay, Troutman remarked, “I cannot say enough wonderful things about NovusWay, the staff family, and all the constituents and volunteers that I was privileged to work with in my years of service. Construction Begins on Pauline Schmertmann Wing



Construction began in January on the long-awaited Pauline Schmertmann Wing at Luther Springs. The Wing will provide another twelve double occupancy guest

rooms, each with a private bathroom, and will increase the adult capacity to 60 in comfortable guest rooms. The naming gift for the center came from Dr. John Schmertmann in memory of his wife Pauline, who died in March 2014. Previously the Schmertmann's made naming gifts for the Welcome Center and Meeting Room in the Kuehner Center. Gary Klein of Orlando, and a former NovusWay board member, is serving as general contractor. Mission Builders are already on site to help with construction.

A gift was also received from Ed Morgan, Sun City Center, FL, to build the Cinda Morgan Lake Pavilion at Luther Springs. The Pavilion, located near the waterfront, will serve as an outdoor classroom for the Living Lab Outdoor School (environmental education) Program and serve as a rainy weather shelter for summer campers. While funding is in place, it is undetermined if the Pavilion will be completed this winter or next fall.

In addition to the Pauline Schmertmann Wing, proceeds to the Mission Possible Campaign have enabled construction of a fifth camper cabin in the Morgan Village along with an addition to the Kitchen known as “Alberta’s Kitchen.” Pastor Jan Setzler, Campaign Director, indicated that while commitments are nearing \$2 million, additional gifts are needed to fund the Atonement Chapel and Meeting Room, recreation field, teaching dock, for debt retirement and to purchase land at the entrance to Lutherock. McKanna-Sandrock Retreat Center Construction Update

Construction is proceeding on schedule for the new retreat center at Lutheranch with a mid-May completion date, according to Craig Rieger, VP of Sites and Facilities. As noted in the accompanying photo, the residential section of the center has windows in place and heavy timbers were installed for the St. Timothy Great Room. The entire structure should be enclosed by the time this edition of the LINK is printed. Rieger also indicated that the May completion date will enable the center to host two weeks of summer camp in June.

Rieger, who works out of the home office in Asheville, NC, indicated that two volunteers have been on-site weekly to monitor construction. They are pictured at left, Mike Mynhier and John Didicher. Rieger exclaimed, “We couldn’t have undertaken this project without the diligence and dedication of Mike and John. They have truly gone above and beyond the call of duty and have been an unbelievable blessing to Lutheranch and NovusWay.”

Rieger indicated that \$650,000 is still needed to fully fund the new retreat center. I'll continue to celebrate her life and mourn her passing knowing that she cherished the opportunity with her husband Jim to make such a gift. I had the pleasure of seeing Vivien and Jim participate in ground-breaking ceremonies for the McKanna-Sandrock Retreat Center at the SE Synod Assembly, in May, 2016, and when they attended the inaugural Gala for Lutheranch, held last August in Atlanta. Their shared joy was truly a blessing.

Over the years, NovusWay has been blessed by many other remarkable gifts. I am also reminded that Luther Springs will soon receive distribution from a trust that was first established in 1990 and was designated to "The Lutheran Camp of the Florida-Bahamas Synod." 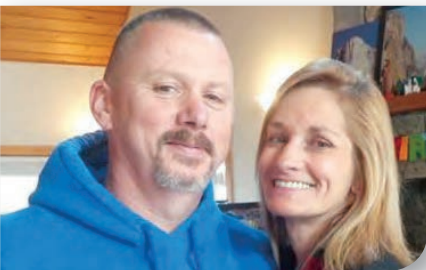

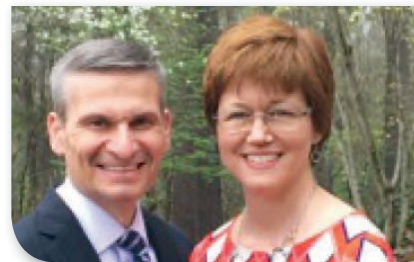

A Place Apart – New Lutheridge Staff Alumni Group Launched

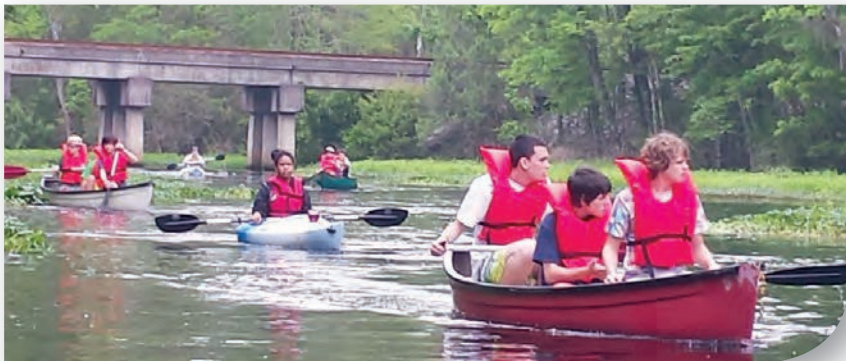
