ver 100 friends from across the southeastern U.S. gathered in Lineberger Hall at Lutheridge, on Friday, November 3, 2017, to thank Keith and Lori Johnson for his 24 years of service as Executive Director of Lutheridge+Lutherock Ministries and NovusWay Ministries. He officially retired at the end of 2017. The event was organized by the Board of Trustees and included former and current board members, donors, executive staff and other friends of the ministry.

Board president, Larry Moeller, Knoxville, TN, announced that over \$100,000 had been committed by board, staff and donors to create the "Keith and Lori Johnson Youth Outreach Endowment." It pushed NovusWay's scholarship endowments to over \$1 million to ensure that all are welcomed at NovusWay sites and programs regardless of their ability to pay. In accepting the gift Keith said, "one of my proudest accomplishments over the years has been to create a culture where all are welcomed regardless of the ability to pay with special attention to cross-cultural campers, and we're honored that an endowment in our name will help to accomplish that objective."

Your Gifts Change Everything... That's Why We Ask



Would you make a gift in 2018 to ensure that campers, counselors, and guests are offered a life-changing experience at Lutheridge, Lutherock, Lutheranch and Luther Springs?

Last year, your gifts to this ministry supported 450 campers with scholarships. A camper scholarship provides financial support for a child who would likely not be able to attend camp without financial support. Campers receive partial scholarships, based on a family's ability to pay, or financial support from their church. The average cost of a scholarship

is \$540. We expect to support a similar number of campers in 2018, and we'd like to do more. Scholarship gifts also help the ministry keep costs down for all campers.

Supervisory senior staff and college-aged camp counselors are the heart and soul of the camp experience. In advance of the summer camp season, senior staff and counselors are hired to provide Christian leadership for summer programs. We've learned, over the years, that a camper to counselor ratio of 7 to 1 is most effective for ensuring relationships are nurtured in a safe, interactive, faith-centered environment. We've also learned that college-aged counselors add to the camp experience in profound ways related to their meaningful interactive relationships with youth. Your gifts enable the ministry to hire senior staff and counselors.

Summer salary for a supervisory staff person, on average, costs the ministry \$4,100 including benefits; the counselors are hired at each site at a cost of about \$3,300 each, including benefits. While the numbers vary at each site, the ministry hires about 30 senior staff membes and 100 counselors combined.

As basic elements of safety and procedure, summer staff members receive support and training. Lifeguard and water safety training ensures that swimming pools and lakes are safe places; wilderness first aid training and ropes course training ensure that outdoor adventure programs are safe. While costs vary at each location, your gifts enable this ministry to provide critically important training at a total cost of about \$20,000.

If you, or your children, have had the camp experience you likely remember that nursing supplies are a summer camp need. From band-aids to epi-pens, we want every "skint" knee, every encounter with poison ivy, and every bee sting to be remembered as a well-treated event. Nursing supplies in 2018 will cost the ministry about \$6,000. Your gifts will help to guarantee that "emergencies" of all shapes and sizes are well-treated.

Camper experiences are different across all four sites. Many campers at Lutheridge go on an outing during their "camp experience" either to Pisgah National Forest or the Dupont State park. Lutherock campers visit Grandfather Mountain or Linville Caverns and Luther Springs campers visit Florida National Parks. Fees associated with taking campers to one of these national treasures typically cost the ministry about \$7,500 each summer. Outsourced transportation, for these outings, has proven to be safe and reliable, at a cost of about \$27,500 each summer.

An example of ways this ministry is serving the larger community, the Reach-Out Connect program brings cross-cultural campers to Lutheridge and Lutherock and includes transportation for the campers from the Atlanta area. The program, which depends on church and community partnerships, is exceeding expectations. These transportation costs average \$4,200 each summer. At Luther Springs cross-cultural campers are welcomed each year from the Rez House which serves children of migrant farm workers. Each camper receives a scholarship and transportation support.

Lastly, as you can imagine, there are a multitude of supplies needed to make the camp experience special. From crafts materials to fireworks and songbooks, the summer camp season is loaded with activities and fun. Costs for these supplies average about \$26,000 each summer. When you count the smiles and listen to the laughter, it seems like quite the bargain!

ugust 5, 2017 was an important day in the history of NovusWay Ministries and the Southeastern Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as it marked the dedication of the beautiful new McKanna-Sandrock Retreat Center in Tallapoosa, Georgia.

NovusWay Minsitries conducted capital campaigns generating over \$8.9 million in a span of about 10 years to purchase the 519-acre property near Tallapoosa Georgia and build the 40-room conference and retreat center. The establishment of the new state-of-the-art center responds to a critical need to meet the growing demand for youth and adult outdoor Christian ministry opportunities in the Southeast.

A \$2.2M gift from Dr.'s James McKanna and Vivien Casagrande helped to meet critical campaign goals and Board-directed benchmarks that allowed construction to begin.

Dr. McKanna is grateful for his Lutheran heritage that goes back to the Wilhelm-Loehe-Missioanire-Schule in Neuendettelsau on the Sandrock side of the family. In fact, several of his ancestors emigrated from Germany in the 1850's as missionary pastors to North America, including a great-great grandfather Georg Grossman who founded Wartburg College and Wartburg Seminary in Iowa. Pastor Sigmund H. Sandrock, Jim's grandfather who is memorialized in the McKanna-Sandrock Retreat Center naming, served numerous congregations in Iowa before "retiring" as a founding administrator of the
