

(And That Changed Everything)

y wife and I decided to take our family vacation at Lutheridge's Family Camp in 2018. When we first read the NovusWay brochure, we thought the Family Camp program was brand new. We were looking for something different than a resort; something that could help us connect as a family; and something that could



help us connect spiritually.

When we first arrived at camp and began unloading our cars, we were greeted warmly by other guests.

We quickly realized that many of the other guests already knew each other and some had been here for the last eight years. We felt like outsiders for a few moments, but the other guests immediately began inviting us to join them outside, sit with them at dinner, and hang out during free-time. During the first couple of days, Family Campers kept mentioning the magic of Family Camp at Lutheridge. Eventually we realized it was not so much the place, but the people and their Christ-likeness that made it so special and magical.

I would like to illustrate this with two examples. First, the other families were so kind, generous, and loving to us and our kids. My daughter, Evie, was playing in a kickball game on top of the mountains, when she made an error in the game. She was really upset and ran off the field to the side to begin crying. My wife and I watched from a distance at the picnic tables. My wife's first instinct was to run over to

Evie and begin consoling her. I arabbed her arm and told her to just wait a second. Almost on cue, one of the older airls went over to Evie and began to encourage her to go back out there and try again. I could see Evie crying and saying no, but the little girl was persistent yet

encouraging. She finally convinced Evie to keep playing and soon there was a smile across her face. I was so moved by that little girl's actions because it is exactly how I would want my children to act when someone is upset and withdrawing. She modeled exactly what

Evie should do when she's the big girl and sees a friend upset. The power of peer modeling is strong; I spoke to Evie about it afterwards and will continue to draw upon that experience when I teach and counsel her as she grows.

The second magical example was similar, but with our other child, Shane. It was pool time and at the pool was a big, fun water-slide. The kids went up and down it several times. Shane is not a swimmer yet but wanted to do what all of the other kids were doing so he climbed up to the top of the slide. When he got to the top of the slide though, he simply sat there. Behind him, were about fifteen anxious little kids waiting their turn. The lifeguard urged him to go down. I was across the pool and began urging him. My wife Edie tried to climb up there but didn't want to go down the slide, nor go down the steps. Some of the kids started to yell for Shane to go ahead. None of the urging was mean-spirited or impatient, but again, encouraging. The groups of teens and tweens playing volleyball began to take notice that the slide activity had come to a halt and began yelling encouragements for Shane to go down the slide. Then one of the older boys began chanting "Go Shane." Almost immediately, everyone began chanting "Go Shane." The entirety of the Family Campers were chanting "Go Shane." And the little boy, apprehensive about sliding, still stood there a few more seconds before finally sliding down to a myriad of cheers and applause; that was magic. He splashed up from the water with a big smile and went

NovusWay, in particular, at Lutherock where they have been directors the past five years. Kara and Jacob have themselves been shaped by the ministry and have left their imprint on it. Kara and Jacob have been counselors and on the senior staff leadership team at Lutherock before they began service as part of the year-round ministry of NovusWay. Kara used her organizational skills in the registration office, while working with church and school groups at Lutheridge and Lutherock, before becoming the assistant program director at Lutheridge. Jacob has long provided leadership for non-summer program groups as well as direction for the Outdoor Adventure Program of Lutheridge and Lutherock. Together they led five safe, meaningful summers at Lutherock, adding to programming for younger campers while developing that site. Together they also launched Living Waters Outdoor School providing a strong base for future growth of that program. It is hard to measure the impact Jacob and Kara have had on thousands of campers and staff while sharing their gifts with NovusWay Ministries. Having re-located into their own home in Arden (at Lutheridge) last August, with parents (grandparents) and close friends to support them, Jacob will be continuing his work with Biltmore Estates while Kara will begin a position with Outward Bound. Registration Improvements and Updates in 2019

As many of you may have noticed, much has changed in recent years regarding online and manual registrations for the ministry. It is very important to us that we continue to make improvements that better serve our guests. In the fall of 2018 we made some upgrades to our online user software and we wanted to share some of these changes with you.

The biggest improvement was the addition of individual registration portals for each of our four sites. This feature allows guests to see only programs for the site they have selected, which means guests no longer need to scroll through pages of content for all our sites just to find their desired program. We have also reformatted the way in which programs are displayed for online users. This cleaner format means that users can quickly identify the program for which they want to register and then select the week they want to come. As with all our updates, we are monitoring guest satisfaction and so far, the results look good. We plan to gradually start implementing changes to the group registration and family camp registration process this year; Users can expect to start seeing these changes as early as Fall 2019.



In addition to software updates we have restructured the registration department and added Anjanette Clifton as the new Lutheridge Registrar. Anjanette moved to Asheville in November of 2017 after serving with her family as missionaries in Chiang Mai, Thailand for three and a half years. Securing the Future of Luther Springs and Lutherock

Mission Possible Campaign Exceeds Goal!

The Florida-Bahamas Synod's Mission Possible campaign to secure the future of Luther Springs and Lutherock met and exceeded the campaign goal by December 31, 2018. Mission Possible gifts and pledges, as of December 31, total \$2.276 million. The campaign's base goal was \$2.235 million. *"I'm truly grateful to God,"* reports Mission Possible's Campaign Director, Pastor Jan Setzler, *"for the 43 congregations in Florida and North Carolina and the hundreds of donors in those congregations who helped us do what many thought could not be done.*

We reached and exceeded the campaign goal." Campaign contributions to date are helping to secure the future of Luther Springs by expanding facilities. New construction at Luther Springs includes a fifth camper cabin, Kinports kitchen expansion, another adult housing wing, and a lakeside classroom for the outdoor environmental education program. An additional commercial washer and dryer and new flooring to replace the carpet in Kinports, gifts of Kent and Donna Richter, are also much-needed additions.

Mission Possible funds helped to secure the future of Lutherock with the purchase of two critical pieces of property – a 52 acre tract that included the entrance to the property and a "buffer" parcel near the pinnacle that prevents further encroachment from developers. The "buffer" parcel is funded by campaigns in three of the original North Carolina congregations to whom the original 50 acres that are now Lutherock were given.

"God is not finished with us yet," Pastor Setzler gratefully admits. "We have three construction projects at Luther Springs yet to do. We have to get the Atonement Chapel and Meeting Room built this year. We have to build the teaching dock to complete our environmental education program facilities. And we have to enclose Kinports' porch to become a lounge and overflow dining." The latter two projects have been funded by naming gifts.

"To construct the Chapel", Setzler says, "we need additional funds. We recently learned that construction costs increased on average 5% a year since we prepared the campaign budget in 2014. We budgeted \$350,000 to build the Chapel." Bids today are at least \$100,000 higher, reflecting increased construction costs. "I'm deeply grateful to God for at least four more congregations that have indicated a willingness to conduct Mission Possible mini-campaigns to help us raise the additional funds needed to get the Chapel built. I believe God will raise up the donors and funds we need to build the Chapel this year," Setzler stated. It could be you. n October of 2018, Hurricane Michael ripped through the Panhandle of Florida before it turned north, wreaking havoc in Georgia, Alabama, and the Carolinas.
